## The Doorways and the Impacts of Sin

Genesis 3:1-21 (NASB)

## I. Doorways: 1. Choosing to believe ourselves, someone else, or something that \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ the word and authority of God (vs. 1-5). 2. When we set our mind and affections on \_\_\_\_\_ and the things of the \_\_\_\_\_ (v. 6a). ## **III.** Questions to consider:

- 1. Have you been guilty of exchanging the truth of God for a lie, or of not challenging a lie (internally or externally)?
- 2. Has what others have said stirred your emotions and affections, thereby tempting you to respond in a way that is out of line with Scripture?
- 3. What blessings in your life are overlooked and unappreciated because you have set your mind on the wrong thing? Do you need to confess and repent of this?
- 4. Are you guilty of leading others to sin?
- 5. Are you guilty of calling what God says is bad good, and good bad?
- 6. Is pride an issue for you? When the Holy Spirit confronts you, have you tried to hide, ignore it, or blame others instead of surrendering to Him?
